

Legend for Percent Change in Drug Overdose Deaths Between 12-Month Ending Periods








Rate of All Drug Overdose Deaths, 2020



Overdose Risk Among Incarcerated

- High prevalence of SUD among incarcerated <u>link</u>, <u>link</u>
- Incarcerated populations are among the most at risk for overdose.

- Studies demonstrating efficacy link, link, link








